As a governing body, under the Education Act 2010 and the more recent statutory guidance from March 2013, school's responsibilities for career guidance further extends from Yr 8 to Yr 13.

'The purpose of this guidance is to identify the key responsibilities of schools in relation to careers guidance for young people. Schools have a role to play in supporting their pupils to make well informed and realistic decisions by providing access to impartial and independent information and guidance about the range of education and training options that are most likely to help young people achieve their ambitions'. (Statutory Guidance March 2013)
